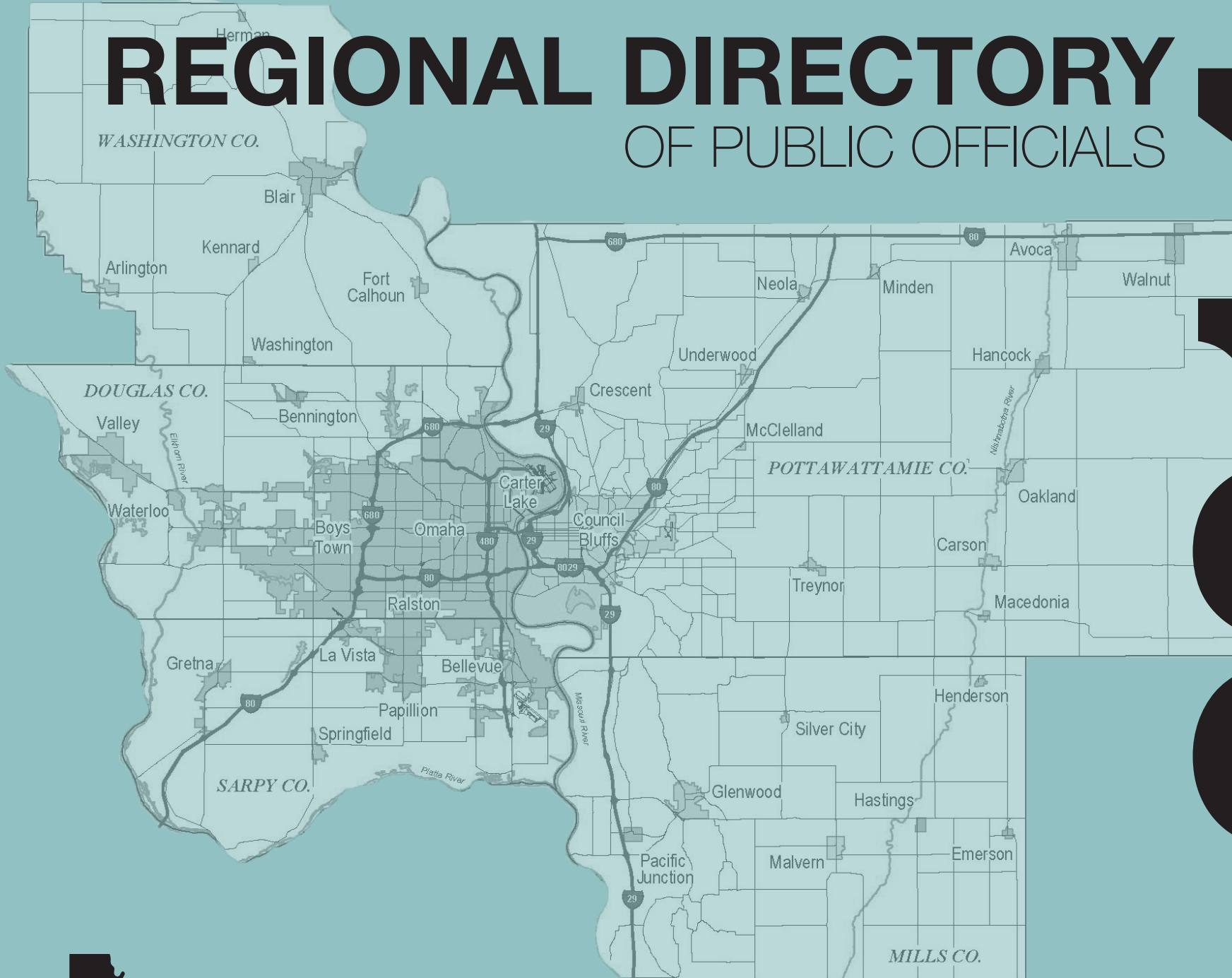

INTRODUCTION

We are pleased to present the thirty fourth edition of MAPA's Regional Directory of Public Officials. The directory identifies over 1,900 elected and appointed officials and key staff of the five counties, 38 towns, 1 city council, and 19 "special purpose" governmental entities that are members of the MAPA Council of Officials. Also identified are housing authorities, chambers of commerce, school districts, the two area-wide community colleges and other "special purpose" public and state agencies. It also lists Nebraska and Iowa state legislators and United States Senate and House of Representatives members who represent the MAPA region, and a selected listing in Harrison and Shelby counties, Iowa and Cass County, Nebraska.

PROCEDURE

MAPA maintains an ongoing update process based on communication from jurisdictions and the monitoring of election results. During the first week in January, contact persons in 112 "entities" received a computer listing applicable to their jurisdiction for verification. All either returned the updated form or responded to a follow-up phone call. The final product went to press in May.

ORGANIZATION OF THIS DIRECTORY

This directory is in alphabetic sort by jurisdiction and by title within jurisdiction and a geographic sort is provided in the Alternate Table of Contents. We hope that the "general purpose" and "special purpose" governmental entities, the meeting times section, the 2000 Census population numbers and the MAPA Council of Officials list will also be useful. Included is a special section describing staff expertise by topic.

FORMAT

The directory contains ten columns, many of which are self-explanatory. However, some special codes and abbreviations need clarification.

NAME -- Name of person in an elected, appointed or key staff position. Surnames are entered first separated by a "/" symbol from the first name. In addition, the name field may contain one or more numbers or letters within a bracket. The numeric designation refers to a ward or election district. The letter designation refers to an office held within an

organization.

TITLE -- Organizational title of the person in an elected, appointed or key staff position. Because of limited space some titles had to be abbreviated and may not be easily recognized. A key to these abbreviations is provided at the end of this section.

JURISDICTION -- Name of governmental units, agencies and organizations in alphabetic order.

EL/APP -- A single letter that designates officials who were either elected (E) by popular vote or appointed (A) to a Board, Commission or Committee by an elected official or officials. Some appointed positions are staff positions and therefore have no entry in this field.

TERM EXP -- The month and year in which an official's term expires.

OFFICE PHONE -- The individual's number at the jurisdiction offices. Area codes are shown within the number by symbol. Example: 328*6000 means the area code is 712. Symbols are shown here.

MAILING ADDRESS -- The street address preferred by the individual for receipt of business correspondence.

"General Purpose" and "Special Purpose" Government"

This directory identifies public officials in the five-county MAPA area but does not include all elected officials. For example, elected members of educational service units and sanitary and improvement districts are not included. Decisions to include certain organizations were based on the degree of involvement with MAPA.

General purpose local governments - counties and cities - form the basis of this directory. All incorporated places are termed cities in Iowa. In Nebraska there are villages and four classes of cities based generally on population size. In Omaha, both the city and *the Omaha City Council* are members of MAPA.

Many special purpose local governments operate in the region. School districts, whose boundaries have been historically established, may cross county lines. All K-12 school districts in the MAPA region are included. Two community colleges are also listed. The *Metropolitan Community College* covers Dodge, Douglas, Sarpy and Washington counties in Nebraska. *Iowa Western Community College* in Iowa covers Harrison, Pottawattamie, Cass, Mills, Page and Fremont counties along with parts of Montgomery and Audubon counties.

Counties and cities maintain advisory committees and independent bodies that carry out special purpose functions. These include bodies such as Planning Boards and Commissions for jurisdictions throughout the region. State laws allow the cities of Bellevue, Blair, Council Bluffs and Omaha and Douglas County to form *housing authorities*, whose governing bodies, which have the power to hire staff, maintain a budget and make policy decisions, are appointed by the parent jurisdictions.

State law also allows the operation of the Airport Authority of the City of Omaha (doing business as the *Omaha Airport Authority*) and the Transit Authority of the City of Omaha (doing business as *Metro*).

The Airport Authority operates in the Nebraska portion of the Omaha

metropolitan area; the Transit Authority functions within the city limits of Omaha although it may contract with other local governments to provide service. The Omaha Airport Authority charges user fees to sustain its operations; Metro levies taxes.

There are two public utilities governed by elected directors operating in the Nebraska portion of the MAPA region. The *Omaha Public Power District* provides electric service to 13 counties in eastern Nebraska. Water and natural gas are supplied by the *Metropolitan Utilities District* in eastern Sarpy County and the urbanized area of Douglas County. Both of these organizations charge user fees to sustain operations.

State-authorized "natural resource districts", concerned with natural resources development and conservation and governed by elected bodies, exist in Nebraska. Portions of Burt, Thurston, Dakota and Dodge counties and all of Douglas, Sarpy and Washington counties comprise the *Papio-Missouri River Natural Resources District*. A similar conservation organization exists in Iowa. The eight-county *Golden Hills Resource Conservation and Development* has nine members, appointed by the respective county boards. Pottawattamie County, because of its geographic size and diverse physical features has an east and west representative. Rural and suburban fire districts, such as *Valley Fire District #5*, protect lives and property in rural and suburban areas of counties.

The state legislators in *Iowa* and *Nebraska* are listed in this directory as are the three U.S. Congressmen and four U.S. Senators representing the MAPA region. Both the Washington and local office addresses and phone numbers are listed for the congressmen and senators. The MAPA Board of Directors, Council of Officials, and administrative positions are located under the MAPA listing.

Activities set forth in the agency's work program are carried out by a 19-member professional and support staff, headed by an executive director.

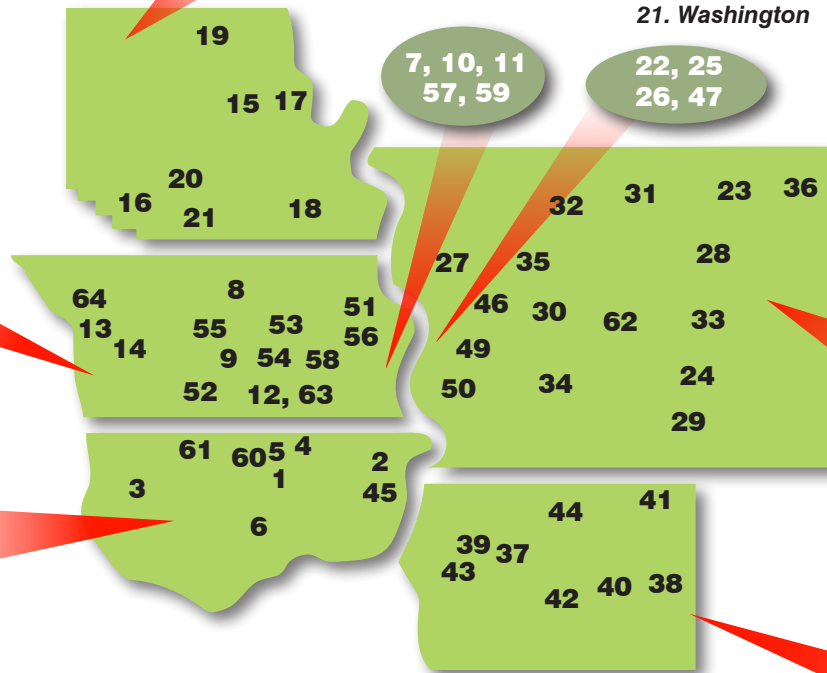

Membership - Any governmental unit within MAPA's five-county area can belong. Current membership consists of 5 counties, 38 towns, 19 special purpose governmental entities and 1 city council.

Funding - MAPA does not levy taxes. It receives its financial support from federal, state and local contributions and from contracts for services. Local general support is based on a ratio of county population to the local population of all member counties according to the latest official census.

Authority - MAPA has no regulatory powers. It can consider any matter which may or should involve interlocal governmental cooperation or coordination. It recommends, but does not implement, plans and programs that it prepares, reviews or adopts. It also provides review and comment on local applications for federal and state funds.
