#### a. Local Foods Hub Proposal – (ACTION)

Mr. Jeff Spiehs presented to the Committee for discussion a potential opportunity for MAPA / Heartland 2050 Local Foods Council. The United Way local foods committee (SWAG) has completed a plan identifying actions steps to move forward with the local food efforts. One of the steps identified the role of convener and facilitator and they are looking for an entity to serve that role. MAPA has been identified as a potential agency that could serve in that

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role and house an individual that would lead those efforts. The United Way committee is committed to identifying funding for this role. Staff noted that the intent is to add a staff member to do the additional work. With the committee's favorable recommendation, this will go to the MAPA Board of Directors for final approval.

The committee is looking for support/leadership for the air quality and water quality workgroup.
- <u>Vicki Quaites-Ferris Equity and Engagement Committee</u>: The Equity and Engagement Committee has
  recently gone through a restructuring with changes in the Heartland 2050 boundaries. The committee
  is working through the recommendations that came out of the most recent Heartland 2050 Summit and
  the Equitable Growth Profile update. They are also working to develop presentations that are
  meaningful and impactful when sharing the information and data to the community.
- Zach Reinhardt Housing and Development Committee: The committee has formed three working
  groups are public sector, private sector and community/non-profit. They are working on developing
  communication and education strategies for each stakeholder group.

- → Coordinate local, regional and state investments through a regional capital improvement program similar to the MAPA Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- → Coordinate economic development investments with infrastructure investments and housing development

- → Encourage shared water and wastewater resources and coordination of services and treatment facilities to provide for multiple cities within drainage service areas
- → Provide efficient access to a diverse portfolio of reliable energy sources, including renewables, distributed energy generation and conservation practices



# GOAL #3 NATURAL RESOURCES – Leverage Natural Systems for Recreation and Resiliency

Ensure long term sustainability of our region by increasing access to natural environments and providing resiliency from natural disasters.

#### **Strategies**

- A. Preserve our natural resources through a safe regional trail and green space system
- B. Manage and conserve water as a beneficial resource
- C. Protect and enhance air quality
- D. Effectively reduce and manage solid waste and landfills
- E. Ensure a sustainable system of local agriculture that provides food to the region and protects agricultural land use

- → Create a H2050 Regional Park and Trail Partnership
- → Develop a Regional Trails Marketing Plan
- → Complete a Regional Natural Resources Inventory
- → Complete a Regional Green Space and Land Use Assessment

#### **Manage and Conserve Water**

#### **Protect and Enhance Air Quality**

- → Identify opportunities to beta-test technologies, programs and policies to meet changing air quality regulatory requirements

#### Reduce and Manage Solid Waste/Landfills

- → Maintain waste management areas that utilize regional landfills and minimize transportation impacts
- → Use methane generated by solid waste treatment for energy purposes
- → Encourage regional adoption of the integrated solid waste hierarchy
- → Provide increased access to recycling pick-up and drop-off centers

#### **Ensure a Sustainable System of Local Agriculture**

- → Continue and expand H2050 Local Foods Coordinating Council
- → Expand local food access year-round
- → Implement a plan to produce equitable access to fresh local food
- → Develop a local, self-reliant food economy
