the census.

#### Outcomes

• Having 100% participation.

• Allowing, having a clear understanding of the benefits that

filling out the census will have.

• Gaining participation through the easiest means to get the

message across (such as coordination with

business or utilities )

#### Challenges

• Getting the positive word out – as some citizens live in fear

of the government cracking down on them and are

non-trusting.

- Getting an appropriate amount of response.
- Making the census accessible for the public as some communities may have little access to technology.
- System & Technology assistance having someone help those who are disabled or non-technological to access the

census

• Ability to include and reach out to specific populations

(assisted living, group homes, etc.) and make sure that they

are counted.

Money/funding

Filling out only one census per household and making sure

households are counting every child no matter how young.

Identifying addresses with accurate count of people living

there by means of using USPS listings.

• Challenges with those who have P.O. Boxes.

by having employer or students and/or parents take initiative

to fill out census at a set time or event.
