- o March 12th (arrival), fill out as soon as possible
- Online Response (first time availability)
- o Three Ways to Self Respond: Online, Phone, and on Paper

March 2nd - 15th

"Who Should Respond to the Census?"

- Who is counted? Everyone
- One Person per household/living quarters
- Who lives there by/on April 1st
- o All children, born before or on April
 - 1st

March 16th - March 30th

"How/Why Will I Submit My Census"

- o For the future of the children
- Respond on paper, by phone, or
 - online
- o Civic Duty

- Mandatory
- Funding
- Congressional Seats
