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MAPA's Executive Director leaving agency for New Career Path

A childhood interest in maps and cities, which expanded later into architecture and planning, fueled the career choice of MAPA Executive Director Greg Youell. Now after more than 18 years with MAPA, and 21 years overall in the field of planning, Youell is setting his sights on a new career path. He will leave the agency in July to become Operations Director for Spirit Catholic Radio Network, which is based in Omaha.

Youell began his career at MAPA in 2002 as an Assistant Transportation Planner, and was promoted to Transportation and Data Manager in 2008. The MAPA Board of Directors hired him as Executive Director in December 2012.

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Glenwood to add Affordable Housing Rental Units

Forty units of affordable housing will soon be added to Glenwood's housing stock. The Iowa Economic Development Authority awarded the City a \$6 million Disaster Recovery Community Development Block Grant to help construct the Burr Oak Apartments.

The apartments must be rented to households that are at no more than 80% of the federal median family income

MAPA secured the grant funding for this project and will act as grant administrator.

Construction of Burr Oak Apartments is expected to begin in Fall 2020.

Iowa and Nebraska pass legislation to expand broadband access

New laws passed this year in Iowa and Nebraska aim to bridge the digital divide by expanding high-speed broadband access for each state's residents and businesses.

lowa's law includes \$100 million to set up a two-tiered statewide grant program giving priority to areas of the state with the lowest broadband speeds. Service providers may apply to have the state pay for 75% of the project cost in these areas when it increases upload and download speeds to 100 megabytes per second.

access with networks built to upload and download speeds of 100 megabytes per second.

To help determine areas where broadband expansion is needed most, MAPA is a partner in the Broadband Speed Test initiative. The test is open to all Nebraskans and lowans in Pottawattamie and Mills Counties. Data collected will help inform decision makers on areas that need boosted services. In areas equipped already with internet systems where improvements are needed to speed up the service, the state contribution drops to 35%.

MAPA Board approves Transportation Improvement Program

MAPA's Board of Directors approved the FY2022-FY2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) at its June 24 meeting.

The TIP is a six-year document, updated annually, which documents the progress toward projects that include federal transportation funding. It includes projects such as highway maintenance and expansion, bicycle and pedestrian trail work, Metro Transit projects and aviation projects.

The TIP also includes updates to projects in the Omaha-Council Bluffs region led by the Nebraska Department of Transportation and the Iowa Department of Transportation during the next four years.

been rewarding. The TIP fee, which provided a new local revenue source, was big in terms of adding financial stability."

The TIP fee is an administrative fee MAPA collects from local governments for the work involved in securing, allocating and administering federal funding for their projects which are part of MAPA's Transportation Improvement Program.

Spirit Catholic Radio is more than just a radio network, it brings people together to build a positive culture. When the door opened for the Operations Director position, it just felt like the timing was right."

And he will leave with the Board of Directors respect and gratitude. "The board is grateful to Greg for his service to MAPA and we wish him the best in his future endeavors," said Kindig.

Youell's last day at MAPA is July 23.
