NARRATOR

Thousands of people across the Omaha area are not able to drive on their own, they have disabilities and rely on public transportation for everyday needs.

INT. STUDIO INTERVIEW AREA - DAY

NARRATOR (V.O.)

Public Transportation allows access to society's events and opportunities, but is it always as fair, affordable, and efficient as it could be?

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D) People living with a disability are more likely to use public transportation, what difficulties are they encountering that could be remedied with better funded transportation systems?
