*Members of the public are welcome to speak on agenda items, but should identify themselves by name and affiliation (if applicable) before speaking. Individuals interested in addressing RPAC regarding non agenda items must sign the request to speak list located in the meeting room prior to the beginning of the meeting or in writing by regular U.S. mail or email (mapa@mapacog.org) provided that requests are received by close of business on the day prior to the meeting. Members of the public will be limited to three minutes. The presiding officer shall have authority to limit discussion or presentation by members and non-members or to take other appropriate actions necessary to conduct business in an orderly manner.*

*The participation of fifteen (15) voting members of the Regional Planning Advisory Committee shall constitute a quorum. The vote of two-thirds (2/3) of members present shall decide questions brought before the Committee.*

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
