- C. Regional Market Value Analysis: Jeff Sauser and Sarabrent McCoy, CommunityScale
 - a. Through a grant from Front Porch Investments, <u>CommunityScale</u> is developing a regional Market Value Analysis tool to share real estate market and neighborhood data
 - b. Market Value Analysis: An interactive baseline database of market conditions across the region.
 - c. Purpose: Support data-driven planning, community investment, and policymaking around issues of housing access and affordability, community stability, displacement, and related concerns.
 - d. Users: Municipal planners, non-profits, philanthropists, elected officials, and other partners across the region.
 - e. Format: An interactive mapping tool that supports analysis at all scales, from neighborhood to region.
 - f. Update: MAPA intends to update the MVA model and database in 3 years to refresh the tool and also provide added longitudinal perspective on change over time across the region.

 - b. Metro Transit is seeking public comments on the introduction of a new mictrotransit pilot program
 - i. Three year pilot program funded by local philanthropy
 - ii. To help meet gaps in transit availability
 - iii. Currently will cover trips in three zones: North Omaha, South Omaha and West Omaha
 - iv. Will supplement other transit service
 - v. Is a shared ride experience, so you may be riding with other passengers
 - vi. Anticipated that the fee will be around \$3 per ride
 - vii. Currently finalizing the contract with the service provider for service to launch in 2025
