New townhomes help Minden rebuild after 2024 tornado

Six new townhomes are under construction in Minden as the town continues to rebuild after the devastating Arbor Day tornado in 2024.

The tornado destroyed more than 40% of the housing in the Pottawattamie County community.

The Minden Great Western Townhomes, being built by Habitat for Humanity of Council Bluffs, are three duplexes, which will provide six two-bedroom, two-bath units when completed.

A groundbreaking ceremony took place Oct. 8th at the site.

Minden Mayor Kevin Zimmerman said there is already a list of people who are interested in moving in to the townhomes. The Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) prepared the successful grant application and is administering the grant.

The townhomes are anticipated to be completed in the Fall of 2026.
